Community Support

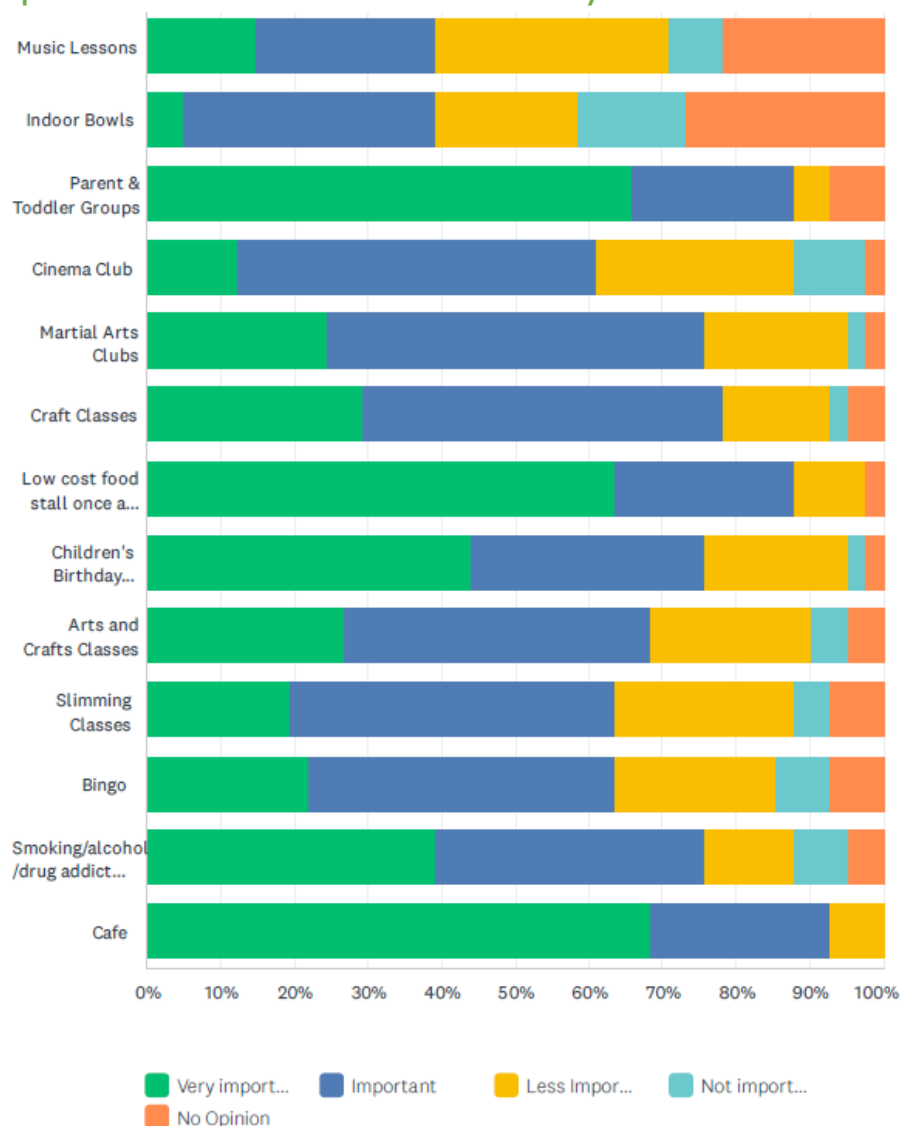
The re opening of the Community Centre must have the backing of the local community in order that it meets the underlying need and the identified demands and that it is adopted and used by local residents. This will help to ensure sustainability in future. Cadder Housing Association undertook two community engagement methods as follows:

- Postal survey delivered to local households in Cadder in April/May 2023;
- Face to face survey carried out by staff and volunteers at Cadder Carnival day in June 2023

This section analyses the responses to these surveys in order to confirm community demand for a re opened Cadder Community Centre.

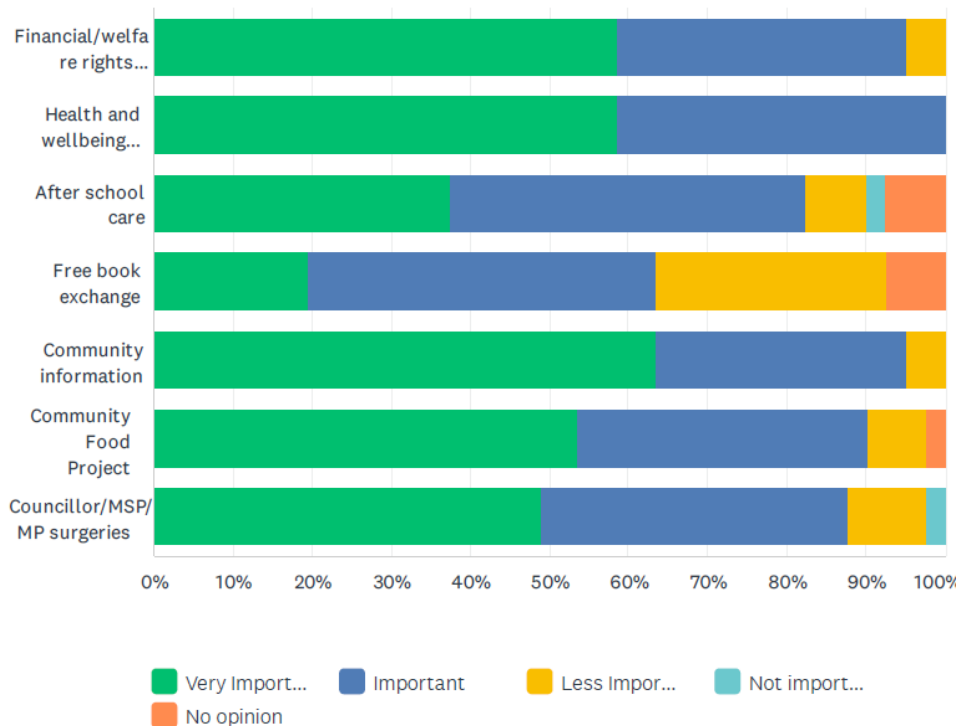
Community Survey

Importance of Activies in Cadder Community Centre



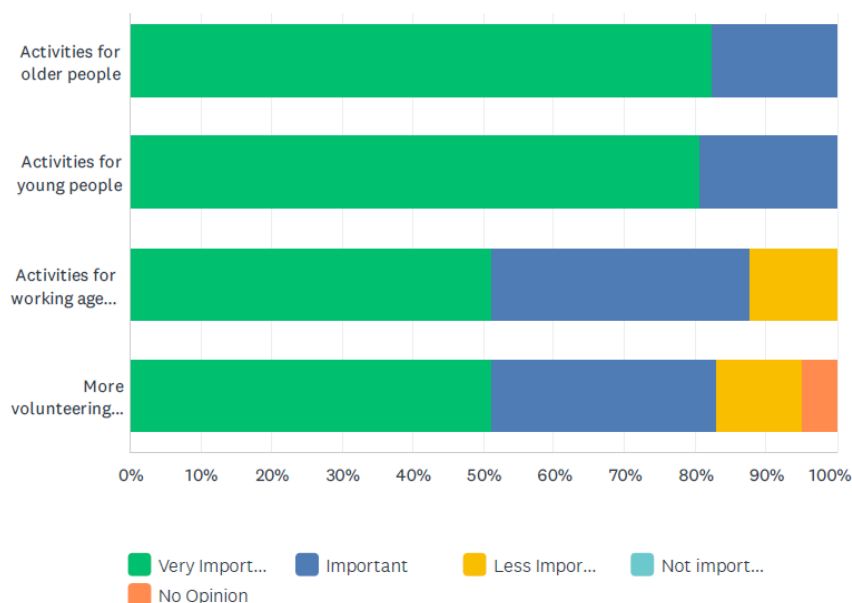
The table above highlights the requirements for the re opened centre to provide a parent and toddler group, low cost food provision and a café. While these had the highest levels of activities which were deemed very important, other activities which scored a high combine of very important/important included Martial arts clubs, craft classes, venue for children's birthday parties and activities/services to reduce smoking/alcohol/drug addiction.

Importance of Services in Cadder Community Centre



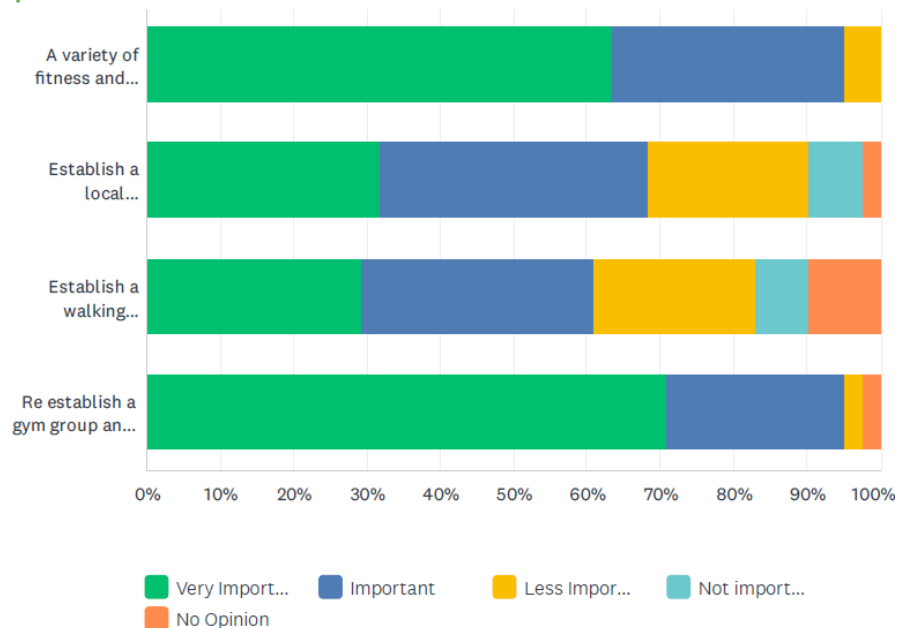
Community information scored highest across respondents, closely followed Welfare Advice and Health and wellbeing services which scored only positive responses.

Who should new activities be aimed at



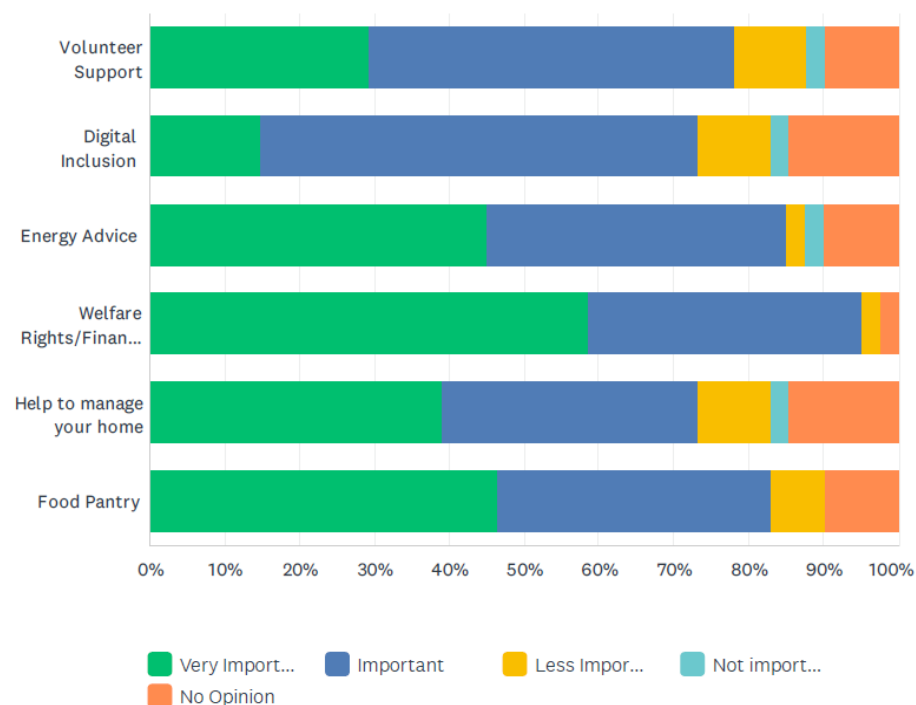
Support was divided with activities considered to be focused at those residents at the opposite point of the age spectrum.
